### **JUST A FEW DAYS LEFT TO FILE DIRECTOR ELECTION NOMINATIONS FOR NAMPA PRECINCT OF THE NAMPA & MERIDIAN IRRIGATION DISTRICT**

Individuals who want to compete for the position of Director of Precinct 3, the Nampa Precinct, of the Nampa & Meridian Irrigation District in the upcoming November 5 election just have until September 26 to file a nominating petition with the District, NMID officials said today.

“Time is running out for people who live in the Nampa Precinct 3 and who want to help manage the affairs of the Irrigation District to file the nominating petition so their name can appear on the ballot in the November 5 election. We encourage them to contact us as quickly as possible so we can outline just what needs to be done,” noted Daren Coon, NMID Secretary Treasurer.

Potential candidates for the Precinct 3 position, currently held by Clinton C. Pline and which has a three-year term of office, must live in the Nampa Precinct 3 and meet other qualifications set down by law. Individuals who are interested in filing a nominating petition for the directorship should contact the District for more information at (208) 466-7861.

Precinct 3 is roughly bordered by McDermott Road on the East, McMillian Road on the North, Plum Road on the West and Bennett Road on the South. A map of the Nampa Precinct 3, along with other information about the election, is available at the NMID website:

Individuals must follow a specific set of procedures under Idaho law to file the nominating petition. So it is critical that individuals meet the September 26 filing deadline if they want to contend for the position in the November election, Coon added.

Idaho law states that no election will be held if only one qualified candidate is nominated by the September 26 deadline. Instead, the Board of Directors will declare the candidate as elected.

The Nampa & Meridian Irrigation District is a water storage, conveyance and distribution system founded in 1904. The District supplies irrigation water to some 69,000 acres of farmland, residential and commercial lands including pressurized irrigation for more than 17,000 individual parcels of land in Ada and Canyon counties.
