### **Voters To Pick Meridian Precinct Director** **In Nov. 6 Nampa & Meridian Irrigation District Election**

Nampa & Meridian Irrigation District voters will decide November 6 at the polls who they want to be the Director of the Meridian precinct for the next three years, officials with the valley's largest irrigation district announced today.

Will Patterson and Stephen Warren will vie for the position on the election ballot. Patterson is the incumbent while Warren will challenge him for the post. The person receiving the most votes will be declared elected at the canvass of election returns meeting set for later in November, according to Daren Coon, NMID Secretary Treasurer.

The polls will be open on Tuesday, November 6 from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. There are three voting places, one for each precinct, which can also be found on the District's website at [www.nmid.org](http://www.nmid.org). The locations are:

- Precinct No. 1: Horizon Elementary School, 730 North Mitchell Boise, ID 83704;
- Precinct No. 2: Meridian Middle School, 1507 W. 8th Street Meridian, ID 83642; and
- Precinct No. 3: Nampa City Hall, 411 3<sup>rd</sup> Street South Nampa, ID 83651

“Property owners in the District should make every effort to cast a ballot on November 6. Director elections are very important because the person voters choose will represent the precinct on the District's three-person Board of Directors. The Board members are who manage the overall operation of the NMID irrigation water delivery operation,” Coon said.

NMID patrons from all three precincts can vote in the election. Early voting, both in person or by absentee ballot is allowed. Voters who want to take advantage of the early voting service should contact the District office at 208-466-7861 for more information, Coon added.

Idaho law requires that individuals voting in the election complete an oath in which they certify they own land within the boundaries of the Nampa & Meridian Irrigation District; that they are a resident of Ada, Boise, or Canyon County and that they possess all the qualifications required by Idaho's general election laws.

The Nampa & Meridian Irrigation District is a water storage, conveyance and distribution system founded in 1904. The District supplies irrigation water to some 69,000 acres of farmland, residential and commercial lands including pressurized irrigation for more than 17,000 individual parcels of land, including 479 subdivisions in Ada and Canyon counties.
